4. Briefly explain your interest in participating in an exchange program with Chinese students. Why China? What makes you a good fit for this opportunity? (Please limit your answer to ½ page.)

5. Please choose one time (since high school) in which you had to work with a team of people toward a common goal or project. Describe what you learned from the experience and your role in the group's work. (Please limit your answer to ½ page.)

6. Please elaborate on your preference for YUNA or L(U)CY. What attracts you to this particular program? If you wish to be considered for only one of the programs, please discuss that program. If you wish to be considered for both programs, please discuss your first choice program. (Please limit your answer to ½ page.)

7. The theme of each exchange program is intended to provide an opportunity for in-depth cross-cultural learning and interaction. This year's YUNA theme is "Collective Memory and Generational Identity." This year's L(U)CY theme is "Social Entrepreneurship." Please answer parts A and B in essay form.

A) What does the theme of your chosen program mean to you? What would you bring to a discussion/study of issues related to this theme? (Please limit your answer to part A to ½ page per program. If you are applying to both programs, please discuss both themes, limiting your answer to one page total.)

B) Based on your answer to part A, please describe a day that you might plan for the visiting students during their stay in New Haven. Include activities related to the theme and also social activities. Be creative and do not worry about logistics for the purpose of this question. (Please limit your answer to part B to one page. If you are applying to both programs, you only need to address one program for part B.)
